## **ESSA: Policy Basics**



## State Accountability Plans (Year 1: 2017-18)

Annual accountability indicators, subgroup disaggregation, comprehensive and targeted state/district interventions

## **Annual Testing**

Grades 3-8 and once in HS based on "challenging" State Standards;

## **Educator Equity Plans**

Ensure low-income and minority students are not taught at a disproportionate rate by ineffective, out-of-field, or inexperienced teachers

## **Teacher Quality**

Funds can support induction, mentoring, teacher/leader preparation, alternative routes for state certification.


## Authorized funding increases

e.g. Preschool, Title IV, technology, student supports (community schools, etc.), and family engagement strategies and programs

## Why Accountability for Equity Matters




Overall by High Need (SBAC 2015)




## Why Accountability for Equity Matters
